

A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

Scarcity or Abundance—What are you looking for? February 2022

A few years ago, I read a fun book by A.J. Jacobs called The Year of Living Biblically: One Man's Quest to Follow the Bible as Literally as Possible. It's important to note that Jacobs, a journalist and author, is Jewish and agnostic. For one year, he tried to follow every biblical "rule" as literally as possible. This includes well-known rules like "Love your neighbor" and the Ten Commandments, as well as lesser-known commands to stone adulterers (which he does by throwing little pebbles at a rather cranky man he meets in a park who brags to Jacobs about an affair he is involved in). Jacobs also decided to follow the biblical instruction to tithe, deciding to give away 10 percent of his income.

After convincing his wife to join him, Jacobs gave the donations away to several charities electronically. He describes his experience this way, "The giving was painful. I mean, 10 percent? That would have an impact on our lives. Vacations would need to be scaled back; new furniture would have to wait. It was huge. When I pressed 'send' on the donations, my palms got wet, my heart rate spiked."

In giving, Jacobs felt the fear that is common to all of us. The fear of not having enough. However, that wasn't all he experienced. He continues:

"It was a pain mixed with pleasure. When the confirmation email pinged in, I felt good. There's a haunting line from the movie Chariots of Fire. It's spoken by Ian Charleson, who plays a deeply religious sprinter in the 1924 Olympics. He says: 'When I run, I feel his pleasure.' And as I gave away money, I think I might have felt God's pleasure. Which is odd. Because I'm agnostic. I don't know if there's a God or not, but still I've felt some high sense of purpose. It was like a cozy ember that started at the back of my neck and slowly spread its warmth through my skull. I felt like I was doing something I should have done all my life."

The Stewardship Month

"As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain." (2 Corinthians 6:1)

I encourage you to keep "the Stewardship Month," in February. We often hesitate to talk about "stewardship." We talk about "stewardship" to remind us that we are God's people. God calls us to be good stewards of all we are given, such as our bodies, talents, money, other gifts, even our ideas, and minds. Let us count what we have and how God graciously provides for us. Some may want to say, 'it is not a good time to be talking about "stewardship" because we lost many members during the pandemic, and some haven't come back yet. However, the God who was with us on the prosperous days of the church is still with us. We are God's people, whether we are rich or poor. The church is the body of Christ, whether it is smaller or bigger.

I want to share a story I read a few years ago, "Conversation with God," written by Neale Donald Walsch. He wrote the book based on his true story. He was an ordinary person who was happy with his family and worked at a company. But after breaking his neck in a car accident, he lost his job and became homeless, begging for coins in the street. He suffered every day and complained to God, 'why was he so unfortunate.' One day in winter, he saw two children on the street. They were covered with a blanket. He brought them to his house, turned the heat on, and cooked some food to feed them. He felt happy at home with them, sharing his warm house, abundant food, and caring love. When they left the house, he gave them \$20. He realized that he didn't treat them, but they treated him. Through that event, he noticed that he had a warm house, some food, and money, which God still provided him with, but he couldn't see God's grace because he complained all the time.

We often forget the days we were happy when we face difficulties. And then, we think that all are happy except ourselves. However, remember God is with us always whether we are happy or unhappy. We have experienced the COVID 19 pandemic, encouraging each other to get vaccinated and wearing facial masks. We thought it had gone. It is so-called the period of "post-pandemic." However, it is still going on as the Delta-variant and omicron come along with COVID 19. Perhaps, we might live "with" COVID. We wonder how long we will have to live with all the uncertainties. As we face difficulties, let us rethink God's grace.

FROM THE PASTOR CONTINUED...

The Apostle Paul says, "As we work together with him [God], we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain" (2 Corinthians 6:1). Yes, we work together with God. In other words, we are God's stewards. Therefore, we should work with God in God's grace. I hope that you don't make the grace of God in vain. Keeping the Stewardship Month in February, we may bring the spirit of stewardship back. As I talked with the church leaders, I plan to preach about "stewardship" for the four weeks of February so that we may remind ourselves of God's stewards, and then, we are moving forward. If we do so together in God's grace, we may do more. Again, God calls us to be good stewards of all we are given, such as our bodies, talents, money, other gifts, even our ideas, and minds. Stewardship is not only about "money," but also about our bodies, talents, gifts, ideas, thoughts, even about the relationships with our family, friends, loved ones, and about creation, including our companions like pets. They are all gifts from God, who expects us to be good stewards of all. We have responsibility taking care of all the gifts from God, and giving back to God. Jesus says, "If you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches? And if you have not been trustworthy with someone else's property, who will give you property of your own? " (Luke 16: 11-12).

King in His Own Words



Beloved in Christ, God's people are a language community. We believe God creates with a word that will not return to heaven empty. Not only do we orient life by scripture, but we also make promises through covenants by giving and receiving vows taken in God's presence. We aim our lives in the direction of words like justice and mercy, peace, and steadfast love. Our lives are turned around by words like repentance, and hope.

I would recommend to you the words of Dr. Martin Luther King today. Find a speech online. Take a title off the shelf. Look for quotes online. Better yet, go to https://youtu.be/ejU_mwEAYQc for our online MLK worship service and meditate on the words of King as the service returns to vignette after vignette of his 'I Have a Dream' speech from August 28, 1963. You will be moved as I was.

During the service Ramiah Whiteside spoke of 'mini-dreams' that God blessed him with during a time of incarceration. Those mini dreams lifted him off the hamster wheel of the school to prison pipeline. He spoke about the power of going directly to Dr. King's words. For him, 'A Letter from the Birmingham jail' was transformational.

In Strength to Love, King declared that 'our most fruitful course is to stand firm, move forward nonviolently, accept disappointment and cling to hope.' I have been so grateful for the work done on our quadrennial focus to increase racial justice and radical inclusion, but we are far from being a church without a hint of racism or the harm of othering.

We must remember that Jesus identifies with the despised not out of mere sympathy, but God's divine reorganization and reclamation of the created order.

This gospel has the Spirit's power to lift children being harmed by broken systems, and to relieve the church of its complacency—this is a gospel that frees the smallest life from oppression and rejects systems of discrimination and patterns of prejudice.




I believe only pure and humble love is the essence of life.

God, help us bring together a church that does not allow the evil of racism for even a single moment, and finds those who are always lost and in trouble. Grant that we may be friend the lonely, and generously serve those in need of help. Make us courageous in our practice of the love of Christ.

This year in December the King family asked that our nation focus on voting rights legislation to ensure all people have access to the polls and that congressional district maps and voting mechanisms would not be stained by partisan advantage. We have a long way to go so that justice and mercy are more than mere words. In the spirit of John Wesley, we are called forward by God to grow in love by means of holiness that is personal and social.

O God, make room in our systems and our steps for the liberating activity of Jesus Christ. We know God's word will not return to heaven empty and the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice. Lift every voice and sing, till earth and heaven ring with the harmonies of liberty. Thank God. Let us march on till victory is won. Amen and Amen.
