A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

Inviting Others to be a Part April 2022

"Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened." ~ Matthew 7:7

In his book *Creating Generous Congregations*, David Heetland tells a story about an 8-year-old girl who often gave more than a tithe from her nickel and dime allowance. She once gave her grandmother 38 cents in small coins "for missions." Her grandmother then asked her, "Do you want this to go for homeless people, hospitals in Africa, or buying fish to stock ponds to feed the hungry?"

Her granddaughter replied, "Just a minute," and returned shortly with 29 cents more, making a total of 67 cents to be divided three ways. She found each mission so important that her initial gift was instantly almost doubled so she could support all three.

Too often, we worry that when we ask someone to support a ministry with either their time or their money, the request will be taken as pushy (at best) or offensive (at worst). And there are certainly people who would take it that way.

On the other hand, I believe that not inviting people to support a ministry I'm excited about excludes them from being a part of something that may be transformational for them, and the people touched by the ministry.

Finally, there are many people who are just waiting to be asked to be a part of something bigger than them. They may not be the first to raise their hands when a general invitation goes out but would love to be personally invited to be a part of what God is doing through the church.

Easter Morning

"When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" (Mark 16:1-3)

Early Easter morning in 1993, my family was excited because it was the first time all family members were joining the Easter sunrise service. We dressed up with new white dresses my mother made. We walked toward the church together. I still remember that we were full of joyful noise and laughing on the street. My family sat in the very front pew of the sanctuary. My father was baptized that morning. What a wonderful moment! It was the day that one of my mother's prayers was answered. She prayed that all my family would become Christians and attend worship services sitting together in the same pew in the sanctuary. It was an exciting and grateful morning.

That Easter morning gave us new hope; my family was born again in Christ as a "Christian family." It was a liberating moment from a patriarchal family mindset. Since then, we stopped ancestor worship, which is held thirteen times a year. My mother used to prepare food, and all men attended ancestor worship. They didn't allow women to participate in ancestor worship. But, since my father was baptized, we stopped all ancestor worship. Instead, we started home services with all the family gathered together led by me, a woman leader. Easter morning brought a miracle to my family. In my memories, Easter is a gate of new hope, new beginning and new world, which is a big day for celebration.

However, I wonder if some of you still look for the dead body of Jesus; if you are suspicious and doubtful; if you are still worried like some women and his disciples. Even though Jesus taught of his resurrection to his disciples, no one understood. As soon as Jesus died on the cross, his disciples disappeared, ran away, and returned to their hometown full of disappointment. A few women who followed Jesus went to Jesus' tomb bringing spices, which meant they didn't expect Jesus' resurrection. They looked for the dead body of Jesus "so that they might go and anoint him." They were still worried about "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" However, they met an angel with dazzling white clothes, who told them about "Jesus's resurrection," and reminded them what Jesus taught them. However, they were too afraid to tell anyone (Mark 16:8). The next day, Jesus showed Mary Magdalene, and she shared the news with others. However, they didn't believe it. In the Gospel, the Book of Mark says, "When they heard that Jesus was alive and that she had seen him, they did not believe it" (Mark 16:11).

What about you? Do you believe in Jesus' resurrection? What do you expect this Easter morning? We couldn't keep our church's traditional Easter rites for the past two years due to the COVID 19 pandemic. The COVID 19 pandemic seems to be on the decline, but war has broken out between Ukraine and Russia. The war is not only for those two countries, but it is also affecting people all over the world. Every morning, we hear the news that there are wars, poverty, refugees, and violence. We pray for it to get better. Instead, it is getting worse and worse. However, let us expect God's work to shine through. There have been times when we didn't think we could make it, but God made things happen. God, who gave us his only Son for the world, because he loved us so much-and still does, He may restore all creation and reconciliation between one another.

I hope that this Easter brings hope to all people who believe in Jesus Christ. As a miracle happened for my family, why wouldn't we expect a miraculous Easter morning? Easter is a great Sunday celebration for all Christians. It focuses on Christ's resurrection, ascension, and the giving of the Holy Spirit on the first Easter (John 20:22-23). I appreciate our church leaders who work on God's ministry sincerely. We will celebrate Easter season with several events. The "Easter Craft and Bake Sale" at Atlas UMC on April 9th, Maundy Thursday Service and Soup Supper at Central-Grantsburg UMC on April 14th, a Holy Saturday Event at Atlas Park on April 16th, and Easter Breakfast at Central-Grantsburg on April 17th. Let us gather together and celebrate God's miraculous work! Tell people of Jesus' resurrection again and again until all people believe in him. I am excited for this Easter morning, expecting God's other miraculous works.

A Prayer for Ukraine



I have been prayerful about James 1:27 and our siblings in Ukraine: "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself unstained by the world." I know first-hand the ravages of war and the impact they have on children.

The stories of Ukrainian refugees bring the biblical story to mind. The Book of Lamentations begins with a lament for the city. "All her people groan as they search for bread" (Lamentations 1:11). The Chief Rabbi of Ukraine has asked Christian siblings to read Psalm 31 aloud. Thinking of the countless people who are fleeing the dangers of war and fleeing to safety, I struggle with the question, "how can I help them?" Justice for refugees is a central concern for biblical justice. Throughout scripture God is affirmed as a refuge for the powerless.

War should not exist on the earth, and the war that is being waged must be stopped through dialogue and diplomacy, and by every means possible through the nonviolent action of world leaders. This war launched by Russia cannot be morally justified. We are opposed to wars that kill humans and harm our collective global habitat. War is born of fear. At its root, fear makes us attack our neighbor. Violence always ripples more violence.

Christians are called to make peace and live in peace. It is God's calling to realize that peace not only within us, but also in the present world reality. The heart of God is torn as well. Russians and Ukrainians and their neighbors, too, have been put in harm's way.

As a General Board of Global Ministries partner and an episcopal colleague, I worked with Bishop Edward Khegay, bishop of the Eurasian Conference, on several occasions. We've brought in a partnership to help the Methodist Church established there in many ways. He was with us in Wisconsin. Of course, the Eurasian region is a parish that includes Ukraine and Russia, now enemies of each other, at one table. The pain and turmoil of the bishop's span of care there is beyond comprehension.

I want to be in solidarity with the many world leaders and faith leaders who oppose war. We are earnestly praying that this war will be stopped by the Prince of Peace as soon as possible. Please join me and others across the world who are praying daily for peace and our humanitarian response. May our efforts of solidarity include the welcome of refugees that is inevitable. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), the humanitarian relief arm of Global Ministries, is in communication with partners in the region and actively exploring the coordination of humanitarian response in Ukraine. Please prayerfully consider supporting UMCOR's International Disaster Response efforts by making a gift to Advance #982450.

In the account of Jesus walking on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35), the disciples do not recognize Je-sus until they invite him to stay with them and he sits and breaks bread. Similarly, in our churches, it is through sharing with one another that we experience Christ among us.

The Covid-19 crisis has an increased impact on those who live paycheck to paycheck and weren't able to stockpile basic needs. And in places like the Yankton Sioux Tribe on the White Swan Reservation in South Dakota, the nearest substantial grocery stores are 60-90 miles away. The community was still recovering from 2019 flooding when they were further compromised by the pandemic.

The Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference sent a grant to the tribe to purchase food and supplies and distribute them during the crisis.

Through our giving, we celebrate United Methodist Native American Ministries. As we share in community for this and other denominational giving opportunities, our offerings connect us in ways that recognize Christ among us.

Beyond times of crisis, the special offering supports Native American outreach within annual conferences and across the United States and provides seminary scholarships for Native Americans. When you give generously on Native American Ministries Sunday, you equip seminary students who honor and celebrate Native American culture in their ministries. You empower congregations to find fresh and culturally appropriate ways to minister to their communities with Christ's love.


