A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

What Do You Really Want? March 2023

“He who loves money will not be satisfied with money . . .” Ecclesiastes 5:10

Many people will say that they want more money. But, the truth is that’s not what people really want. As far as I know, we still cannot eat money, make clothes from it, or build a house with it. If we were stranded on a deserted island, it would be practically useless to us.

No one really wants money. Instead, they want what they think it will provide for them. For some people, more, nicer, newer stuff; others want the sense of security or power they think it provides.

I would argue that, until we understand what motivates our desire for money, we won’t be at peace in our relationship with it.

This Lenten season, I would encourage you to take time to figure out your money motivation by taking this [**Money Motivation Quiz**](#). *(It will be emailed with the newsletter and posted on the Upper St. Croix Parish website.)* As it notes, none of the motivations are inherently good or bad, but each does have a “dark side”. More than just allowing us to lean into the positive parts of our motivation and avoid the dark side, knowing that people may have different motivations regarding money than we do, will help us when we deal with money in our relationships.

Ultimately, we believe that loving God and loving our neighbor as ourselves is our greatest priority. It is always easier to do so when we know ourselves well.

Membership Caring Month

“Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, “This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.” So, he told them this parable: Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?”
(Luke 15:1-4)

Perhaps this is your first time hearing about “membership caring month.” Every day must be a day of membership care. So, why should we have membership caring month? It is the same reason we have “stewardship month” or a “stewardship campaign.” Every day must be a day of stewardship, but we have a particular month for “stewardship” because we want to remind ourselves that “we are God’s stewards.”

Membership caring is similar to caring for your family. Family is one of the smallest communities in society and consists of those in the best intimate relationship. They eat at a table together, sleep at a place together, and share their joys and concerns. When they have joys, they celebrate them together; when they have concerns, they try to come to a solution together with prayer. Hearing this, what ideas come to your mind? Yes, a church family or faith community is similar to a family community. While a family community consists of the family blood relations, church family consists of the links through the blood of Christ. In other words, the church family consists of the love of Christ by the grace of God. We eat together at the Lord’s Table; we share our joys and concerns; when one has joy, we celebrate it; when one has concerns, we care for them and try to help them through prayer. If one among the family doesn’t join the table, we wonder if the one has something wrong, and we care for and encourage the one to join the table with us. That’s the family, and family care. However, if we don’t care whether all of our family members join the table, it is not a family any longer.

Jesus showed us what a family looked like in the Gospel. One of them is the story of the lost sheep. Before he tells the story, he eats with all the tax collectors and sinners, sharing God’s story. The Pharisees and scribes were grumbling, saying, “The fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.” Imagine the scene in your mind and what it looks like! In the scene, who would be the family of Jesus? Those who eat at his table or look at them grumbling without joining his table?

Jesus has given us the definition of family in Mark 4:31-35. When Jesus taught the people, someone said, “Your mother and siblings came and asked you to come out.” And Jesus said, “Who is my family?” Looking at the people with him, he said, “Here are my mother and my brothers. Whoever does God’s will are my brothers and sisters and mother!” In other words, the church family are those who eat together at a table and those who follow God’s will. Who are the lost sheep? Who would remain in the wilderness? For Jesus, the lost sheep might be the Pharisees and scribes who didn’t join with him. In other words, in the parable story, Jesus regards the Pharisees and scribes as the lost sheep, and he would leave the tax collector and sinners in the wilderness to find the Pharisees and scribes. As you may know, the Pharisees and scribes were religious leaders. In other words, they knew the law of God but didn’t follow the rules. Instead, they used the law of God to judge the people. They were those who couldn’t see their fault (Luke 6:42).

Have you ever thought about who you belong to? Are you with Jesus at his table, or are you outside of his table, even though you know the words of God? The lost sheep might be those who know God, but don’t follow God’s will. It may be you, one of your family members, or one of your loved ones. The lost sheep is not far, but still there next to you. Let us try to find the lost sheep in March and fill God’s house with them! It is time to come back to God! Let’s come back to God with our loved ones!

MISSIONS GIVING

March Missions:

The March mission will be to collect money to help support UMCOR in the disaster response to the February 6, 2023 7.8 magnitude earthquake (which was followed by a second earthquake of 7.6 and multiple aftershocks) that has affected Turkey and Syria. UMCOR has released grants to long standing partners the International Blue Crescent (offices in Turkey) and the Forum for Development Culture and Dialogue (working in Syria). The funding is to help provide tents, heaters, blankets, warm clothes, ready to eat meals and first aid kits to those who have been displaced. As of 2/22/23 the death toll was 43,556 in Turkey and as of 2/20/23 5,800 in Syria. On 2/20/23 another 6.3 earthquake hit Turkey. Please consider supporting UMCOR mission. -Deb Hammer

We Shall Overcome

“We shall overcome...oh, deep in my heart I do believe, we shall overcome someday!” These words are no less true today as they were originally sung so many years ago. I sing these words as we lament the murder of Tyre Nichols at the hands of five police officers in Memphis. The worldview that creates a division, tension, and acts of violent aggression requires us to examine our Christian response.

“We’ll walk hand in hand...oh deep in my heart I do believe, we shall overcome someday.” Today, we walk hand in hand for those that mourn, grieve, and suffer for the loss of human life, dignity, respect and justice. It is our social responsibility of the Church and Christians to create a world in which each and every person is treated equally and precious.

John Wesley said that “Prayer is where the action is.” So, we must pray for a more just and fair society. My hope is that our prayers drive us to a deep self-examination about the beliefs, systems, and policies that are contrary to the path of nonviolent love and peace of Jesus Christ.

“We shall all be free...oh deep in my heart I do believe, we shall overcome someday.” This month marks the observation of Black History Month, a time when pay tribute to the generations of African Americans who struggled with adversity to achieve full citizenship in American society (<https://blackhistorymonth.gov/about/>). I think about the tradition of the Black Church, which created a golden stem of noble faith even in the midst of oppressive systems and structures, and how that movement makes us more inspired and grateful. In the history of black people's liberation, we see the story of hardship becoming a flower and the story of victory over darkness becoming a song of resurrection.

I ponder how the Gospel of Christ was proclaimed on the streets of America through Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We inherit this passion in our hearts and the nonviolence in our love. The fact that love wins is enough for us to celebrate our Black History Month together.

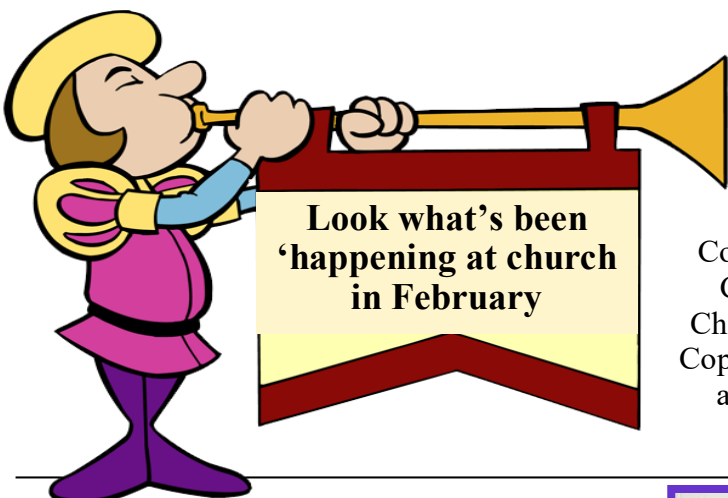
“We shall live in peace...oh deep in my heart I do believe, we shall overcome someday.” We live in a world that desperately needs peace - peace from violence, aggression, and divisions. We look to the Black Lives Matter movement, which has shown us what we did not want to see: the injustice of our systems and the call to remember the names of those that have been treated inhumanely and died violently and cruelly (some even called out for their mom!).

We give thanks for those that have bravely stood before us as living examples of Christ’s love.

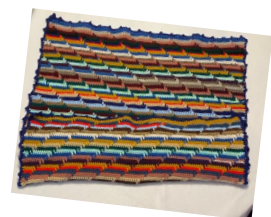

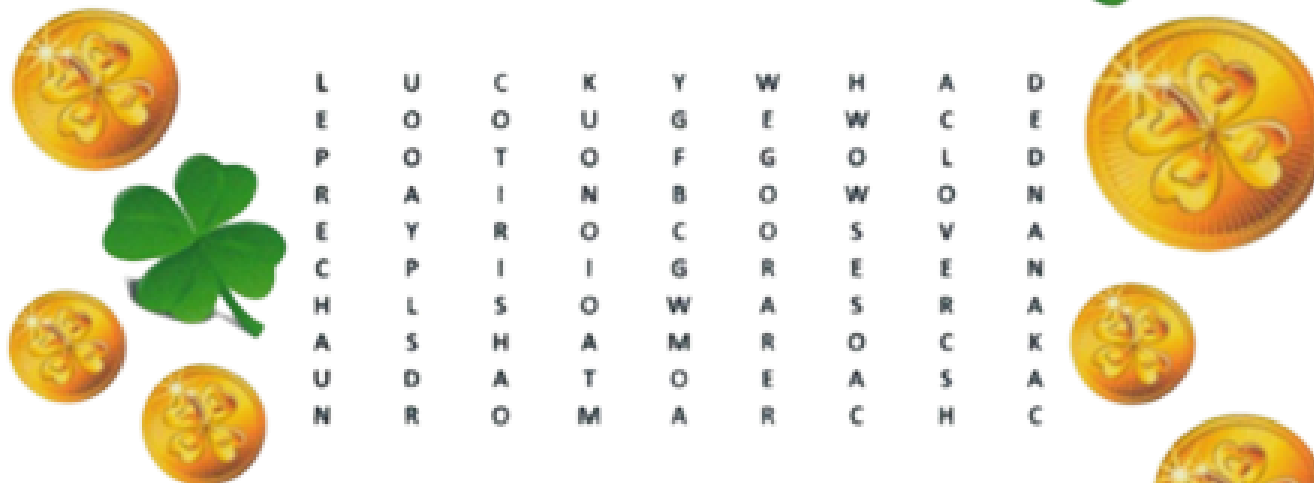

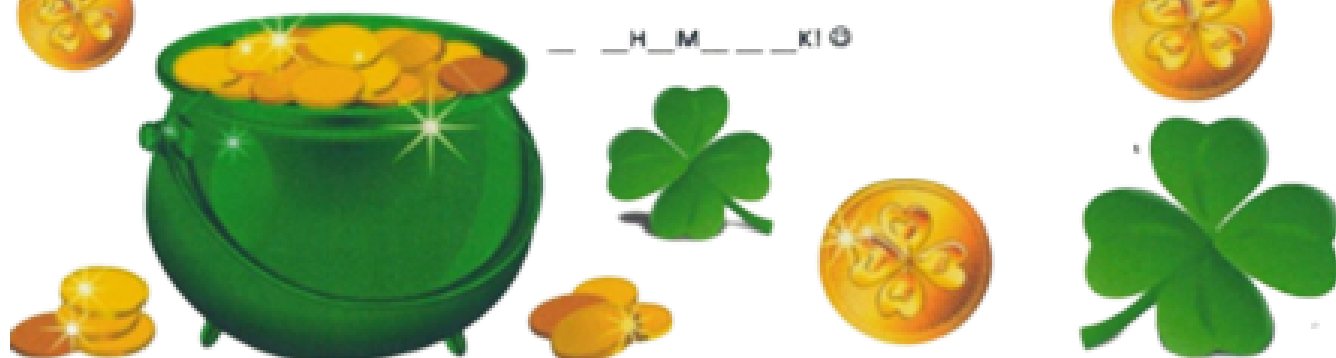
