A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

AI (Artificial Intelligence) has been all over the news lately as technology companies begin to break new ground with things like ChatGPT. The conversation usually centers around whether AI technology will be helpful (increasing productivity), harmful (taking people's jobs), or cataclysmic (leading to machines taking over the world).

Out of curiosity, I asked one of my social media apps that has AI to tell me a story about the impact of generosity. This was its response.

"Once there was a wealthy businessman who decided to donate a significant portion of his fortune to charity. He gave to several causes, including education, healthcare, and the arts. His donations enabled many people to access opportunities they would not have had otherwise.

One of the students who benefited from the businessman's donation was a young woman who had grown up in poverty. She was able to attend college and pursue her dream of becoming a doctor. After graduating, she went on to work in a rural clinic, where she helped many people who had limited access to healthcare. The young woman's work inspired others to follow in her footsteps, and soon the clinic became a hub for community development.

The businessman's generosity had a ripple effect that touched countless lives and transformed a whole community."

I (Jason not the AI) thought that was a pretty good story. I will say, however, it is nowhere near as meaningful as stories I've heard people tell about how they were personally touched by someone's generosity or how being generous changed them. It's not just the story that's inspiring, but the personal, human element that is inspiring.

With that in mind, I'd encourage you to share stories of how your church's ministry either made a difference in your life or you have been impacted by the practice of generosity. It is through the telling and hearing real life stories that generosity spreads and lives are changed.

Let Us Not Become Weary in Doing Good!

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time. We will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have the opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

(Galatians 6:9-10)

A few weeks ago, I walked through my garden, wondering why spring has not come yet. It still felt cold and a soft wind was blowing. It smelled like spring, even though I couldn't see any flowers. Then, I found a few Korean herbs sprouting out in my garden. It was what I had brought from Chicago when I moved here to Wisconsin. I was surprised that many of the herbs were sprouting in my garden. I was disappointed with my garden again last year because it seemed to grow poorly ever since I planted it in 2019. But, this year, the plants spread, making more family plants throughout it. It took four years to spread all over my garden. In other words, it took four years for them to settle in my garden in Wisconsin. It was terrific to see how a plant settles in the ground and grows.

My plants are like me. I came here alone in August 2019. I didn't have any friends or family members with me. Then, I settled in Wisconsin, made friends, and made many family members in Jesus Christ like all of you. I am very similar to the Korean herb I planted in my garden, am I not?

A few weeks ago, I had a meeting with the Atlas Administrative Council members, and we discussed the financial crisis that church is facing. Lots of concerns came to mind, but one of them said, "But we still have hope because it is the church of Christ." Atlas UMC is located in a small farming community, but it has younger members, Sunday School kids and youth confirmands, which is hopeful. We decided to write a letter to the church family and friends to address our situation and ask them to support us more if they can. We met with District Superintendent, Rev. Barb Certa-Werner, to discuss this issue. She suggested meeting with our parish representatives to see if we could share this burden as one parish. So, we met with the Staff-Pastor Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) members, treasures, and Administrative Council chairs. We all have a positive mind, share the burden, and plan to move forward together. We will care for one another and support one another. We decided we go forward together as a parish.

Atlas Administrative Council shared a scripture verse through the letter, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have the opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Galatians 6:9-10). Yes, don't become weary in doing good for God's ministry. It is not only an issue for Atlas; we may all face it, or something similar sooner or later. However, if we don't give it up, God also will not give up on us. The fact that we have kids in Sunday School and youth group in our ministry is such a blessing. As much as we can't give our kids up, we can't give our church up.

FROM THE PASTOR CONTINUED...

Think of our children and youth ministry. We have a youth director and youth and kids' gatherings. They meet typically every other Wednesday, and we have Sunday school, even if it is a small group. Sometimes they seemed to prefer to play games, and not focus on the scripture or Christian teachings, but they are growing in faith. I am sure they will never forget their church experiences as children, even after becoming adults. Like planting a garden, we are planting seeds of faith in their minds and souls, and then the Holy Spirit will make them grow and bear fruits, even though it takes longer than we expected. This year, we received a grant for the Vocational Bible School (VBS). So, we plan to have VBS and youth camp this summer. What a beautiful ministry! Your prayers and commitment are essential to our ministry. Let's go together, sharing the burden! "Do not become weary in doing good!"





"As the president of the General Board of Global Ministries (GBGM), I recently travelled to Maputo, Mozambique, Africa to attend a three-day Mission Partnership Consultation. The African Bishops, conference leaders, the GBGM board of directors and missionaries sent from The United Methodist Church in Africa met, talked, shared, and responded to the works of the Holy Spirit with a moving heart.

It was an indescribable joy and spiritual blessing to participate in this mega-discourse on the kingdom of God and God's work in the field of Africa. We focused on the call to mission, which is the fire that makes us apostles sent from the heart of God to the heart of the world. The Church is indeed the hope of the nations! How many souls, organizations, and human problems are faced with the Gospel and touched by mission work that brings healing and restoration?! Yes, The United Methodist Church is a tremendous witness and gift from God! I remember a participate saying, "Africa is crying out loud for US churches. The United Methodist Church is God's living instrument – impacting the life of millions. So, raise your missionary commission and calling higher! The Lord also comes right into our time of history - with its many scars (like wars and disasters) - and calls our church from the scene of wounds and pain. The level of conflicts and need is unfathomable! The ecosystem cries and warns us of the growing environmental crisis. In all this, The United Methodist Church must meet the Lord Jesus again in the field of missions. We must experience and respond to all that the Holy Spirit is doing and directing. The scale, pace, and intensity of mission activity around the globe demands radical departures from the status quo so we can re-venture within God's redemption plan and also achieve sustainability. Let us continue to support our connectional church, especially as it pivots to navigate significant cultural shifts. Let's embrace the call to re-think the growth, efficiency, and justice needed to radically transform our global neighborhoods.

I had a life-changing experience in Africa. In gratitude, I share this poetry with you:
