A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

Active Discipleship January 2024

A University chaplain had an interesting conversation with a student that came to see him one day. He writes:

"I was wondering what I ought to do about the exam," she said, "then I looked at this bracelet" (here she gestured to the "What Would Jesus Do?" bracelet on her wrist), "and I said to myself,

'I am going to just say a little prayer, relax, and look after myself.'" And I thought to myself, "I can think of at least a couple of other things Jesus might tell you to do — like get over to the library and get busy studying for this exam."

Devoid of specific content, insubstantial, vague "spirituality" may be our contemporary Christian undoing. We have rendered Jesus into someone so vague, amorphous, and flimsy that he makes little claim upon us. Jesus has become a fashion accessory, something tied to our wrist, a comfort, never a challenge. What would Jesus do? Whatever we do, it appears.

This short story reminds me of what a challenge Christian Discipleship. It is easy for us to become a member of a church, attend several times a year, give a little money, and to sit back and relax because we all know that God's grace is free. And yet, we forget that while God's love is given to us freely, if we allow it to grab ahold of us, it changes our lives. Our priorities are no longer our own, but God's. We pray that "God's will be done," not only in a general sense, but particularly in and through our own lives. This means becoming an active part of our community of faith. Giving our energy to worship, instead of being a passive observer. Actively loving and serving our neighbor, instead of just praying for them and hoping for a miracle. Spending time with God in prayer and study. Letting generosity be the top priority in our finances, not just giving what's left over after we've gotten ours.

Christian Discipleship is a difficult enterprise. Thank God we have grace to support us and strengthen us. And thank God we have a community of faith to help us along and to hold us accountable.

"Let's Replant it!"

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14)

Time flies so fast. It has been 5 years since I moved to Wisconsin. We have experienced many things during this time, some happy and some sad. We have faced the challenges of the pandemic, the loss of many loved ones, and financial crisis. Furthermore, these crises initially threatened our church ministry, but, on the other hand, we have managed to recover. God is still with us, and God's love has been evident in our church ministry throughout those crises.

While navigating these challenges, we worked together as one parish, supporting and caring for one another. Through this, we realized that we stand firmly in the faith of Jesus Christ. Yes, indeed, we do!

Remember, we are not alone. We, of course, have steadfast supporters, "Emmanuel God," and the Wisconsin Conference of the United Methodist Church. The United Methodist Churches are highly connectional. I want to remind you how we have overcome these various crises: We received financial support from the Wisconsin Conference of the United Methodist Church in many ways. When Atlas Church faced a financial crisis, the Conference sent us a grant of Equitable Compensation amounting to \$4,636. Additionally, when we were planning Vacation Bible School, the Conference provided us with a grant of \$1,500. Now, as we seek support for youth ministry, the Conference never forsakes us because we are connected in the Body of Christ. Whenever we have projects for our ministry, the Conference is ready to assist us.

Now, we have a new year. What do you want to do for our church ministry in the new year? What is your vision for our church? I believe that none of us wants to see our church ministry come to a close. However, it's important to consider the limitations of our situation, such as our aging population and the decrease in the number of members. Let's refrain from thinking in negative ways. We have already experienced that we can overcome challenges with God's help, as demonstrated through the success of Vacation Bible School (VBS).

The writer of the Letter of Ecclesiastes says, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven" (Ecclesiastes 3:1). It is time to replant the seeds of hope, the seeds of vision, and the seeds of Good News in our ministry. If our churches are aging, we need to recruit younger people through outreach. I mentioned before that without reaching out to people, we can't revitalize our churches. Let's proactively go out and invite people to attend our Sunday services whenever you encounter unchurched individuals. Additionally, let's consider replanting our children and youth ministry and developing unique ministries that align with the gifts God has given us.

Since God has created everyone differently, each person and individual church possesses distinct gifts from God. Let's discover the gifts we have received from God, and based on our unique gifts, let's serve God and our neighbors.

FROM THE PASTOR CONTINUED...

I saw a vision for our church ministry through VBS. Let's replant the seed of the Good News in the next generation to ensure the continuation of our church ministry. As Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (Matthew 19:14). Through the children and youth ministry, we may extend our ministry and the kingdom of God.

Our mission statement is "Let us make disciples for Jesus Christ in all generations with open hearts, open minds, and open doors for the transformation of the world." We cannot transform the world if we don't first transform our minds and hearts to align with God's will. The apostle Paul confesses, "We can do everything in Him (Jesus Christ) who empowers us!" (Philippians 4:13). Yes, we can achieve it with the faith of Jesus Christ through God's grace! Let's replant the seeds of a new vision in a new year!







"Making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" *Ephesians 4:3*.

Our world is facing much division, with issues of wars, responses to major natural disasters, polarization of political stances, and an inability to negotiate a middle ground. As Christians, we must focus on the essence of the Gospel so we can live in the way of Christ. We must obey the prayer of Jesus, Who prayed that His followers might become one - as He and the Father were one.

Suppose the Gospel were divided into "left" and "right" ideologies based on the mantras of our culture. With that, the Church would fail with the first step in following Jesus! Rather, let's turn our focus to Jesus, Who called us to do difficult things, like truly honoring differences, living united, and even loving our enemies. Only Jesus can be the savior of the world, so let's obey His often difficult but important teachings that lead to an abundant life.

Theological prejudice fractures the light that confronts the darkness. The power to fight darkness is not separation but Christian unity and perseverance in love. Since we are members of the body of Christ, we must work hard and strive to love and understand one another no matter what. Suppose the church continues to divide, follows the cultural ways, and focuses on a narrow-minded ideology that favors only one side. In that case, it will fracture the light of holiness and leave us with nothing distinct from culture.

Let's take on the way of Jesus! Let's pray to understand each other, seek ways to strengthen relationships - even through tears, and stay together - even though it may be difficult. I believe that the Holy Spirit is like lubricating oil that grinds away the rough parts and makes us into beautiful and generous people. We are being made perfect in God's love and grace.

I believe the secret to living as siblings in Christ is to become people of prayer and perseverance in faith. I pray that our most significant work will be to love the Gospel and to bear witness to it so that our efforts will not be only in defense of the institutional church but the fruit of obedience to Christ Jesus.




