A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE PAYING IT FORWARD May 2024

"Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow . . . So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up." Galatians 6: 7, 9

According to the Good News Network, 84% of adult Americans agree with the idea that "what goes around comes around." Therefore, the same number also say that they will go out of their way to "pay it forward" whenever possible.

Respondents reported that they were doing so in a number of ways, including:

- ✤ Treating their loved ones to something special (50%)
- Giving generous tips (48%)
- Helping out a neighbor by carrying their groceries or shoveling snow (46%)
- Donating money to organizations or charities (40%)

In addition, almost four in ten said they volunteered their time to help friends or family or supported locally owned business. The average adult engages in five generous acts per week, which adds up to 260 random acts of kindness each year.

Whether it's to align their cosmic mojo or simply acting out of human nature, those who pay it forward believe these acts have real effects on more than those on the receiving end. Americans feel better about themselves (49%), their life overall (37%), and feel more confident (22%) when they extend kindness to others.

"What Do United Methodist Need to Know?"

He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." The LORD Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. (Psalm 46:10-11)



We've been inundated with rumors about the future of the United Methodist Church for several years now, largely due to the postponement of the General Conference amid the pandemic. Typically held every four years to address legislative matters pertaining to our connectional structure, the General Conference has been delayed, with the last regular session occurring nearly eight years ago. Finally, it's set to take place from April 23 to May 3, 2024, in Charlotte, North Carolina. Needless to say, there's a palpable sense of curiosity surrounding the upcoming conference. Let us delve into the proceedings, gain a deeper understanding of what's happening within the United Methodist Church, draw inspiration from ministry stories, and explore how our denomination is making a positive impact on the world.

The General Conference is the only body that can speak for the whole United Methodist Church, which has the authority to make revisions to the denomination's Book of Discipline and Book of Resolutions. The United Methodist Church has no Pope, but the General Conference has a similar role to that of the Pope in the Catholic Church. It is the only body that can set official policy and speak for international denomination. It brings together lay and clergy delegates from four continents whose decisions will affect how millions of United Methodists do church for years to come. It is composed of no fewer than 600 and no more than 1,000 delegates from all the Annual Conferences. The General Conference defines and fixes the conditions, privileges and duties of church membership, the powers and duties of elders (ordained Pastors), deacons, diaconal ministers and local pastors, and the powers and duties of annual conferences also defines the powers and duties of ences and congregational meetings. It authorizes the organization, promotion and administrative work of the church. The General Conference also defines the powers and duties of elders and book of worship, provides a judicial system and procedures, initiates and directs all connectional enterprises of the church, and enacts other legislation for the operation of the church.

At this time, more than 1,000 legislative petitions aiming to shape that future will be before the lay and clergy delegates when it takes place April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina. The Theme for the international gathering, which draws delegates and other church leaders from four continents is, "Be Still and Know that I am God" (Psalm 46). They will take a look at General Conference proposals, such as the Revised Social Principles and regionalization, and celebrate the ministries. May Mission: Collecting Donations for Yung Seon (Christine) Kim in Tanzania.



A few years ago we sent a financially donation to Yung Seon Kim, a United Methodist Missionary in Tanzania. She was fund raising to help build a school. Now, on the outskirts of Dar Es Salaam, stand the Global Mission Secondary School. In 2020 four classrooms, three laboratories, an administration block, well, kitchen, public toilets, dorms, fence and playground were completed. Forty one students came from low income or single parent homes with scholarships that covered half the school fees. In 2022 and 2023 construction continued and a library, cafeteria, small dispensary (clinic), prayer tower, additional dormitories, an office building and the Cornerstone Church were built. Now the school has 148 students, 9 full time and 2 part time teachers, 2 administrative staff, 3 security personnel and 3 cooks.
